Los Angeles County Land Acknowledgement

The County of Los Angeles recognizes that we occupy land originally and still inhabited and cared for by the Tongva, Tataviam, Serrano, Kizh, and Chumash Peoples. We honor and pay respect to their elders and descendants -- past, present, and emerging -- as they continue their stewardship of these lands and waters. We acknowledge that settler colonization resulted in land seizure, disease, subjugation, slavery, relocation, broken promises, genocide, and multigenerational trauma. This acknowledgment demonstrates our responsibility and commitment to truth, healing, and reconciliation and to elevating the stories, culture, and community of the original inhabitants of Los Angeles County. We are grateful to have the opportunity to live and work on these ancestral lands. 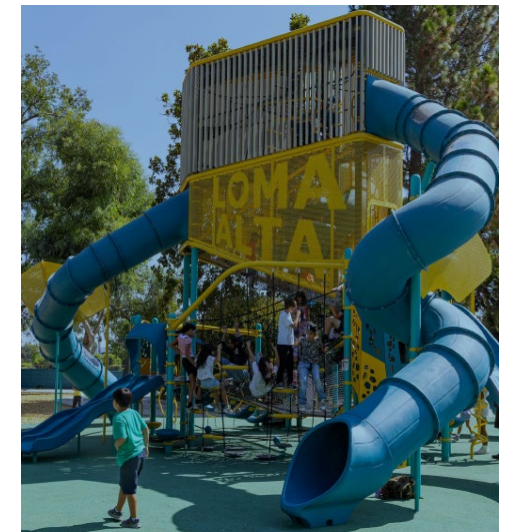
LA County Parks is recognized in three categories:

The NACo Achievements awards provide counties with a platform to share best practices and highlight models for effective public service.



LA County Parks Response to assist Jackie the Eagle

- The County of Los Angeles Department of Parks and Recreation San Dimas Raptor Rescue received a call from San Bernardino County Fire Department regarding a downed bald eagle in the Big Bear area.
 - LA County Parks staff transported Jackie to the San Dimas Raptor Rescue for emergency evaluation and stabilization.
 - Bald eagles are federally protected and require rehabilitation at facilities with specialized federal permits. LA County Parks staff coordinated Jackie's transfer to the Ojai Raptor Center.
- This rescue is a great example of the important role the San Dimas Raptor Rescue program plays in rescuing, stabilizing, and coordinating specialized care for injured raptors throughout Southern California.
- The San Dimas Raptor Rescue currently has 68 raptors in our care. Intake total for July is 45 raptors, 18% more than the 38 received last July. Post-24-hour survival rate is 82%, up 13% from 72% last year.

LA County Parks Supports East Los Angeles residents through Lineage Fire

- City Terrace Park operated as a 24-hour Smoke Respite Center during the Lineage Logistics warehouse fire, providing N95 masks, food, water, shelter, public health information, and pet assistance. The park also served as a cooling center.
- Salazar Park operated as a distribution center for N95 mask, air filters, food and water and also as a Cooling Center.
- In coordination with Supervisor Solis, LA County Parks operated free shuttles from East LA Parks to Santa Fe Dam Swim Beach to ensure families had relief when pools were impacted.
- Staff at senior centers supported seniors through wellness checks, essential services, and emergency resource connections.

Our SPOT Youth Investors Program

- A five-week summer experience in partnership with Youth Investors Corp.
- Teens are introduced to: investing, the stock market, personal finance, income and taxes, debt management, entrepreneurship, and long-term wealth building.
- Participants also create and manage their own mock investment portfolios throughout the program.
- Since 2023, the program has reached nearly 600+ youth and awarded 60+ \$500 grants, representing \$30,000+ invested directly in youth.
- The 2026 program culminated at the Hacienda Heights Community Center with 150 youth and their families.
 - 24 youth were awarded \$500 grants based on their participation, commitment, and the growth and performance of their mock investment portfolios.

Item 5

New Grant Program – Adaptive Play and Inclusive Recreation

- Six regional hubs that deliver weekly adaptive sports programming for its own residents and for neighboring partner cities.
- A shared service model. Smaller cities benefit from being a part of a network program as opposed to launching a standalone program.
- Hub boundaries align with LA Metro Local Service Councils. Investment is directed to high-need communities in the LA County Parks Needs Assessment.

An estimated 1.2 million residents with disabilities in LA County have limited access to recreation that builds community through competitive play.

WHAT IT WILL FUND

Staff, equipment, and weekly programming

01

Staffing and training

- A full-time hub coordinator at each of the six hubs, funded by RPOSD.
- Youth (18 to 25) and veteran positions at competitive wages.
- Certification in adaptive play methodology, disability inclusion, and coaching.

02

Equipment and facilities

- Sport wheelchairs, boccia sets, soccer balls, and nets.
- Site accessibility improvements to ensure ADA readiness at participating city facilities.

03

Programming and outreach

- Weekly programming across all six Hubs.
- Community outreach, recruitment, and public information.
- Coordination meetings, performance monitoring, and evaluation.

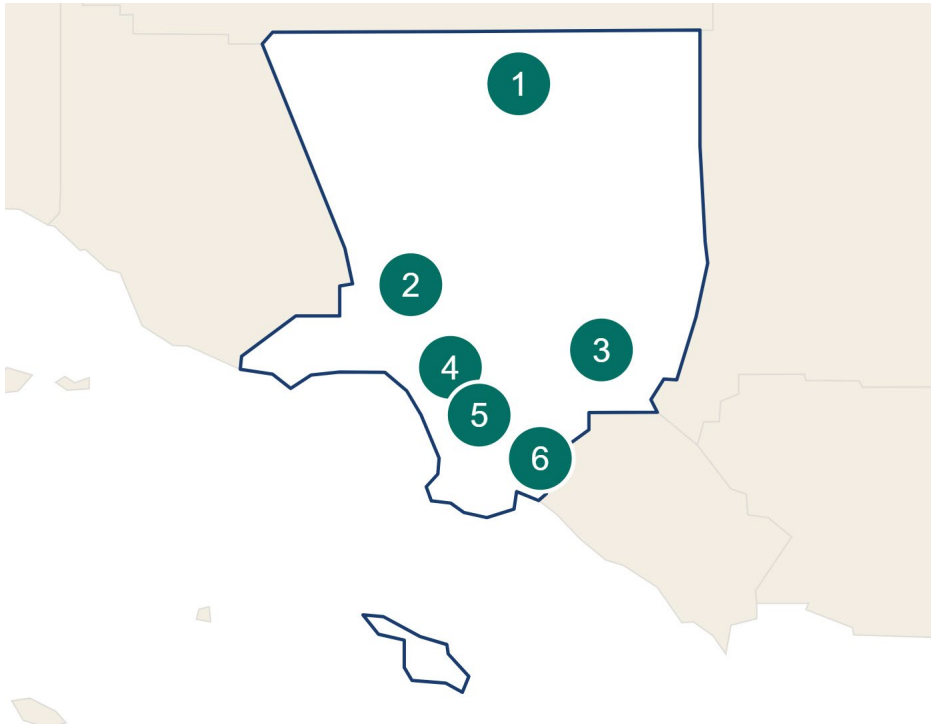

Funds are front-loaded for a strong launch and weighted by the number of residents with disabilities in each hub region. RPOSD will also pursue multi-hub savings such as bulk equipment procurement and joint training.

Allocation announced RPOSD

RPOSD announces the allocation amount to each Hub.

2

Hub planning meeting HUB LEAD + PARTICIPATING CITIES

The Hub Lead and Participating Cities meet to confirm sport offerings, scheduling, and locations, building the adaptive play network for the Hub while staying within the overall Hub allocation.

3

Individual submissions HUB LEAD + EACH CITY

The Hub Lead and each Participating City individually confirm to RPOSD their sport offerings, scheduling, locations, and proposed budget.

4

Grant agreements executed RPOSD

Having reviewed and confirmed each Hub Lead and Participating City submission, RPOSD enters into a grant agreement with each to fund the adaptive play offerings.

Roles

Hub Lead

- Can advertise itself as a Hub Lead in the Los Angeles County Adaptive Play Network
- Will receive dedicated funding to hire a full time Hub Coordinator charged with setting meetings with Participating Cities, publishing Hub-wide calendars, scheduling, and related coordination
- Will receive first consideration for approval of its proposal and budget
- Will receive non-competitive funding for participation, including but not limited to ADA compliance, staff training, and equipment procurement

Participating Cities

- Can advertise itself as a Participating City in the Los Angeles County Adaptive Play Network
- Will receive non-competitive funding for participation, including but not limited to ADA compliance, staff training, and equipment procurement

RPOSD

- Will provide staff trainings at each Hub location
- Responsible for administering grant awards with Hub Leads and Participating Cities, including reimbursements
- Will work closely with Hub Leads to facilitate the successful implementation of the adaptive play network

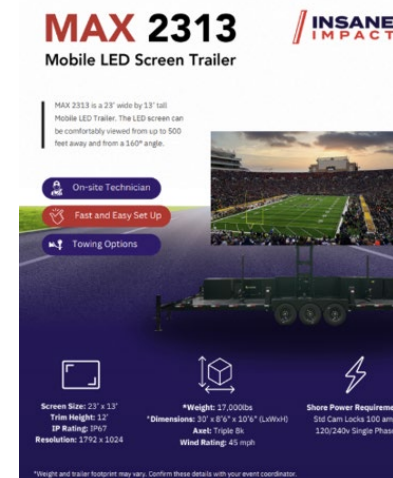

Impacts If Not Funded

Cost Increases for Utilities and Fuel

- Essential costs; bills cannot be paid
- Previously relied on salary savings, which has significantly decreased due to curtailment
- Conservation measures have been implemented

Deferred Maintenance

- Increased risk of injury
- Exposure to claims and liabilities
- Worsen asset deterioration

Various Settlements

- Unable to pay claimants or County Counsel

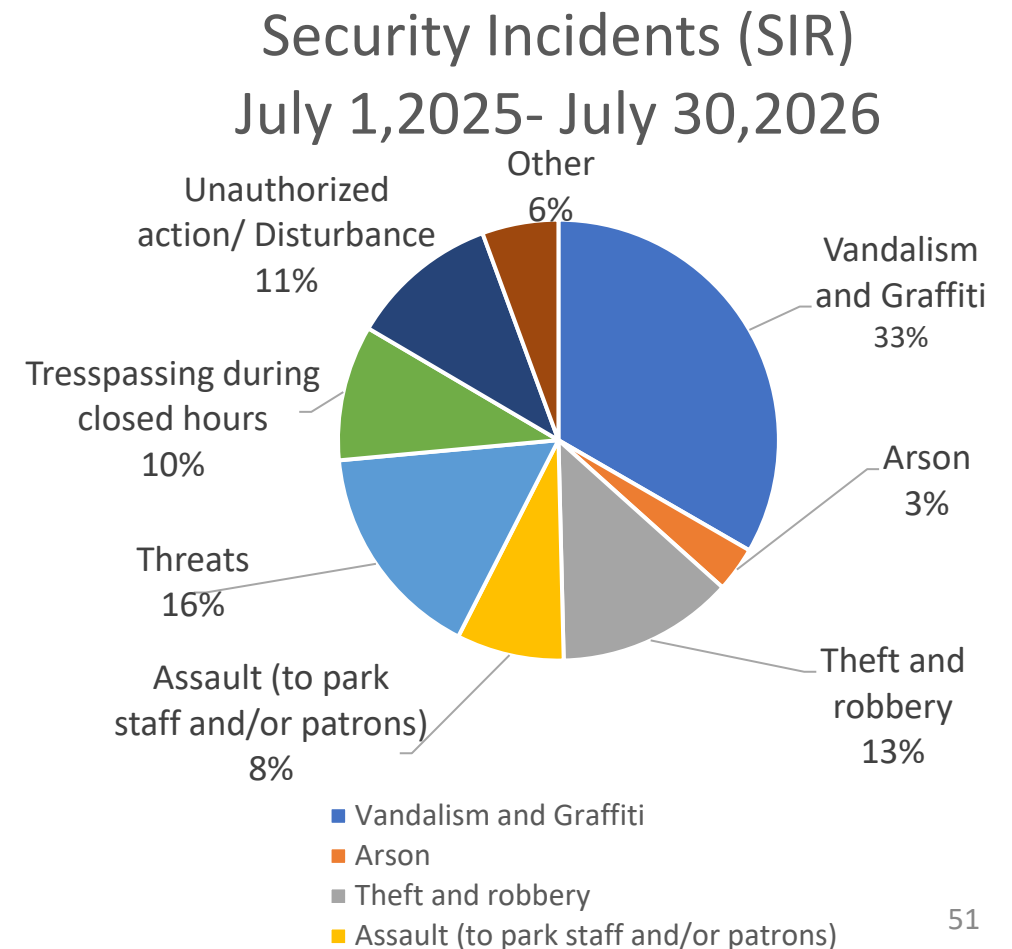

Identifying Security Incident Trends

(Since June 15, 2026)

- There has been a 24% increase in vandalism and graffiti.
 - Maintenance teams continue to work to promptly remove graffiti.
- Park facilities have continued to experience disturbances involving verbal threats, including incidents involving persons experiencing homelessness (PEH).

San Dimas Raptor Rescue July Update

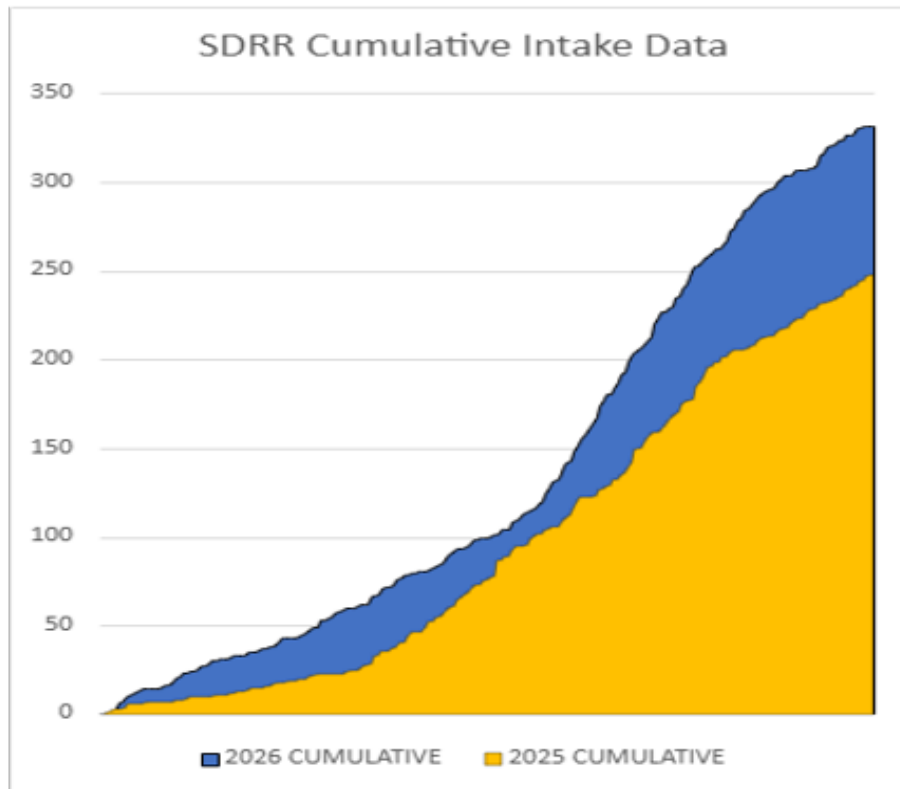


Figure 2 compares intake data from January -July 2025 and 2026

- **Intake total for July is 45 raptors**, 18% more than the 38 received last July.
- Post-24-hour survival rate is 82%, up 13% from 72% last year.
- We currently have **68 raptors in our care**
- This month, 46% of our intakes were babies and 54% were adults.
- As our intakes slow down, we are seeing higher numbers of injuries and fewer babies, meaning we spend more time and resources caring for injured juvenile and adult raptors.
- San Dimas Raptor Rescue supported the rescue of Jackie the Bald Eagle in Big Bear and safely transported Jackie to the Ojai Raptor Center for specialized veterinary care.

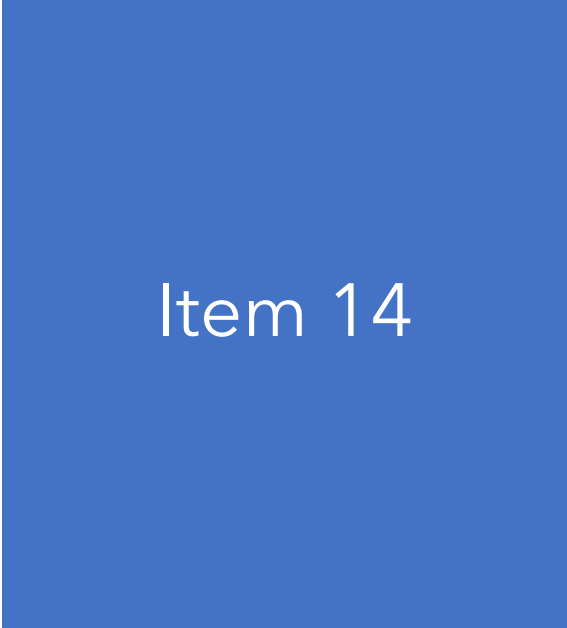
